IT'S A NEW YEAR!

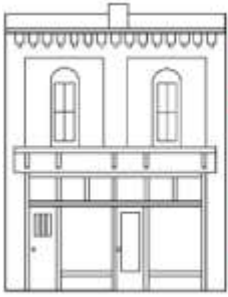
